

### BACKGROUND

- Created by the County following Half Moon Bay shooting
- Multi-department effort ("Task Force") to identify and evaluate all employee housing on unincorporated agricultural/ranch lands
- Ensure compliance with **minimum health and** safety standards
- Owners given a list of necessary corrections and timeframe for completion
- Supports available for displaced households



# Operations Subject to Task Force Evaluation

### TASK FORCE STATUS UPDATE

#### As of July 1, 2024:

- Inspected a total of 170 units, of which **128** units serve as farmworker housing units, occupied by 343 farmworkers.
- Approximately 15 properties remain to be inspected.





# Type of Structure – Farmworker Units

#### Key issues:

- Septic system
- Water supply
- CO/smoke detectors

## Task Force Assessment

Type of Correction Needed	Farmworker Units
Septic system	16
Water supply	30
Wiring/electrical	13
Egress/emergency exits	6
Structural safety issues	6
Primary heat source	12
CO/smoke detectors	22
Ventilation	10

### Water Systems

- Proposed new ordinance that would require owners of farmworker units to be subject to regular monitoring to confirm the water supply meets minimum potability standards.
- Would apply to all owners who provide farmworker housing, regardless of number of units
- Any non-compliant water sources would have to be corrected by the owner




# Septic Systems

- Modify Septic Ordinance to reduce minimum septic capacity (from 3 beds to 1 bed).
- Align farmworker housing unit requirements with Accessory Dwelling Units, which have lower sizing minimums.



### Legal Changes

 Pursue a Local Coastal Program (LCP) amendment to establish a Coastal Development Permit (CDP) exemption for Farm Labor Housing projects in areas that will not impact coastal resources as necessary to comply with Coastal Act requirements.




### Process Changes

- Update Farm Labor Housing Guidebook
  - Include clarifications around RVs and Trailers
- Dedicated staffing



 Information about grants available for addressing code requirements such as all electric installations



Refresh Farmworker Housing Loan Program

 Affordable financing to develop or rehabilitate affordable employee housing for farmworkers


